

ORDINANCE INTRODUCED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF GORDON PROVIDING FOR THE POSTING OF TOWN ROADS IN SEASONAL OR SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

The Town Board of the Town of Gordon, Douglas County, Wisconsin does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Definition of Terms, as used in this Ordinance.

- (a) "Town Road", shall be those roads included in the "Annual Perpetual Inventory", as required by S.S. 86.302
- (b) "Weight Limitations", shall be determined as authorized under S.S. 349.16
- (c) "Exceptions", emergencies where portions of roads and/or bridges are washed out or emergencies declared by higher Government Authority


SECTION 2. Special or seasonal weight limitations, Wisconsin S.S. 348.17, Special or seasonal weight limitations is hereby adopted and shall become effective upon passage and publication

SECTION 3. Town Roads to be Posted, (1) All blacktop roads are to be posted in the Spring. (2) Those sand roads, where logging operations are going on and any other roads as determined by the Town Board, will be posted during those periods as deemed appropriate by the Town Board

SECTION 4. Posting of Roads in Emergency Situations, Roads will be posted in emergency situations, such as washout or portions of roads and/or bridges or any emergency declared by higher Government Authority. In these instances, Town vehicles or Town contracted vehicles will be exempt from weight limitations.

This Ordinance will take effect upon passage and publication.
